He was an advocate for the Coral Reefs and worked continually to research and preserve the Reefs and their inhabitants. He travelled the world with the Shedd and with friends to pursue his love of diving and of the ocean's beauty.

Keith was a kind and loyal man, and an adventurous and fun friend and family member. He was always there to help anyone in need.

His knowledge and passion for his work showed in all that he did.

Keith is survived by his parents, George (Marianne) Pamper and Phyllis Pamper(Gerry Parilli), sisters Kristyn and Kim, and nephew Jim and nieces Terri, Melissa, Jessica, Carly, Annie and Marielle. Preceded in death by brother Kirk.
