



Kathleen Daniels

August 5, 1938 - October 14, 2025

“My father always said ‘You’ll be Irish all your life’,” was something Kathleen Daniels said when she would get emotional when speaking in public. It was a way of explaining that her emotions were powerful, genuine, and always very close to the surface. It was that facet of her nature more than any other that people who knew her will remember most.

Mrs. Daniels passed away at age 87 on October 14th. She was a high school educator for nearly 35 years, and that skill set stretched out to the way she cared about her neighbors, friends, and former students. More than anything else, she was a shepherd of anyone who met her, helping them by delivering advice and assistance whenever they needed it.

She maintained relationships with many former students from her entire teaching career, and as a result, many regularly called or emailed her to get her counsel. She had time for all of them and drew them into her extended family while offering them warmth and comfort.

A graduate of St. Scholastica’s High School, she received a bachelor’s degree from Mundelein College and a Master’s Degree in Education from Northwestern University. She taught English literature at Taft, Farragut, and ended her career by helping found a public school, Best Practice, that utilized a teacher-centric curriculum to immense success. After her husband Tom passed away, she retired and became a consultant that taught other educators how to teach writing.

Even in her retirement, she never slowed down. She did yoga every week and volunteered with various groups at St. Gertrude’s parish, where she was a member - making sandwiches for the homeless, furnishing refugees with supplies to help them when they moved to the neighborhood, as well as any other service she was asked to do. She gardened and walked her dog every day, making numerous friends along the way. She also was ordained as a minister and performed weddings for several of her friends.

She was a teacher, a union leader, a dog lover, a gardener, a lifelong Chicagoan, a poet,

and an Irishwoman through and through. She is survived by her daughter, Melissa Keefe (Kevin) and son Christopher Daniels, as well as by granddaughters Siobhan and Bridget.

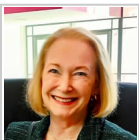
