Michael Nelson Keating, commonly referred to as “Big Mike” and “The Gentle Giant,” born in Chicago on November 6, 1947; passed away on Tuesday, January 12, 2021. A graduate of Roosevelt University with a bachelor’s in psychology, retired from the Illinois Dept. of Human Services as a case worker and also worked part-time in the pathology department of Mt. Sinai Hospital. He was a lecturer and Eucharistic Minister at St. Hilary Parish. Michael was very active and athletic, and often enjoyed going for walks, especially along the river walk and in Horner Park, cycling, playing basketball, weightlifting, swimming at the YMCA, and mixed martial arts (eventually receiving his black belt in Jiu Jitsu). He also enjoyed reading, camping and nature, as well as traveling and road trips. Michael had a love for life and strived at making the world a better place and would often do anything to help others as everyone who knew him would attest. Michael spent time supporting his sister and brother-in-law in Texas in times of illness and recovery. Despite proximity, inconvenience, conflict, or heartache you could always count on him. Michael made a positive impact on everyone he met with his warm, kind, considerate, and gentle ways. He is survived by his wife, Fermina Keating, daughter, Aileen Westover (Daniel), and son, Michael Keating Jr. (Chris Manvel), who all reside in Chicago.
